

Even in regions where normally no dentist ever goes, let alone where there is a dental clinic, we set up our mobile clinic and treat more than 60 children per day - with modern equipment and experienced dentists in the team. That is why the high-quality dental material and the equipment for the mobile treatment stations is our biggest expense item.

Our new program, the treks to the Ger districts of the capital where the most vulnerable live, brings everyone the quality of dental care that they, like everyone else, deserve.

Start of a great adventure



In 2020, we decided to use the experience we had gained during the first treks to the Tsaatan nomads for other regions of Mongolia. We had planned a first trek to western Mongolia for the second half of 2021. But things turned out dif-

ferently. In the summer, a request came from the governor of the Zavkhan Aimag in the west asking if we could come to them in the east. A brief clarification with the dentists in Ulaanbaatar revealed that they were willing to make the 2,500 km journey. And thanks to the support of the German Embassy and the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, we were ready. So we started in August with our three off-road vehicles. Over the course of three weeks we made amazing encounters with people in different sums and 978 children could be treated there.

As soon as we returned to Ulaanbaatar, we prepared for the longer planned 1,200 km journey to the Khentii and Sukhbaatar Province in the East. Material had to be replaced, defective clinic elements



had to be repaired, new transport vehicles had to be made ready because such trips are a great strain on people and material.

During our outreaches we have learned what health care means in remote regions. When the mayor of a sum (village) wants to announce the arrival of the mobile clinic, he usually only can do so by sending people out to the farmers to tell them that we will be in the village in the next few days. The farmers, with no telephone reception, live with their families and herds of animals between 30 and 100 km in all directions around the villages. The parents do everything they can to bring their children to the village at the right time, be it by car, motorbike or on horseback. Even last summer, when it rained exceptionally hard, they came from all directions in all weathers - for the benefit of their children.

Two great journeys with a thousand small adventures lie behind us and we are immensely proud to have treated 2,354 small and sometimes somewhat older patients on the two journeys.

Interview Dr. Jacques Schultheiss, Switzerland

How did the collaboration between SmileCliniX and MKF start?

A professional encounter led to a friendship between me and Gaby Schmidt-Corsitto that has lasted for almost twenty years. I followed her commitment in Mongolia from the start in 2015 in the orphanages of the capital Ulaanbaatar. From Switzerland, we started to supply the Misheel Kids Foundation with medical material.

But your engagement went even further?

Yes! For winter 2018, MKF embarked on a whole new adventure, the trip to the nomads in the north of the country to provide dental care for their children. Gaby asked if we would accompany such a trip. My wife decided to spend a week on horseback in the Mongolian steppe to get an idea of what dental work must be like. She returned excited about the country and the people. In March 2019, Yannick Wälti, one of our dentists, flew to Mongolia and worked with the Trek team. We saw the impressive photos from the trip to the north and heard about the intense effort in treating patients who queued patiently to be treated. Yannick raved about the project, the good organization by the



MKF and the encounter with the children of the nomads. It was clear that we would continue this kind of support.

Have you been on such a dental trek yourself?

No, unfortunately not yet. In 2020, a small team of us flew without me to Ulaanbataar. Dentists Anja Gertsch and Fabiana Lattarulo were accompanied by filmmaker Pascal Brun, who documented the trek. But while still on the journey, conditions changed due to the outbreak of the Covid pandemic. The nomads could no longer be reached and the mobile dental clinic was set up without further ado in two smaller villages. There too, the need for dental treatment for the children was enormous. 341 could be treated.

In 2021 Covid prevented me from travelling there myself. The work is so important - and of course the adventure excites me! All of us at SmileClinix are happy about this unusual and rewarding collaboration and hope that it won't be so long before we are back in action for MKF

Orphanages and daycare centers

Since 2015, we have been working in various orphanages and daycare centers in and around Ulaanbaatar. We treat the children and inform staff and children about dental hygiene and nutrition. On average, 4 to 10 teeth need to be treated per child until they are pain-free. Especially in the orphanages, the diet has also been changed, with visible success in the examinations. There, the children are now surrounded by staff trained by us, so constant care is possible. Today, annual checkup and occasionally few dental treatments are required in these orphanages.

In the daycare centers it is more difficult. Many of these facilities only have the children until they start school, then we lose track of them. Our central goal of all children in a facility having healthy teeth, starts all over again. This changes the long-term financial needs in the day care centers. Initial treatments cost 200,000 to $400,000 \ \ \text{F}$ (about 65-130 Euro) per child, the follow-up treatments only $80,000 \ \ \ \text{F}$ (about 25 Euro).

For 2022/23, the situation is aggravated by the fact that we have not been able to visit the orphanages and daycare centers for almost two years. We are facing intensive years of treatment in all institutions, which we can only manage with your support.







2022 - Focus on the Ger districts

Like everywhere else in the world, people move from the countryside to the big cities, always hoping for a better, easier life than as farmers.

In Mongolia, half of the population now lives in the capital Ulaan-baatar, and not everyone is lucky. Many find it hard to make the transition and end up living somewhere in the city in the traditional tents, the gers, just like in the countryside. In Ulaanbaatar, these Ger districts are growing every year, and with them the number of children growing up in very poor and often unprotected environments. Dental care reaches them just as little as in the remote regions of the country and they often additionally lack the caring parents we witness in the rural areas. In Ulaanbaatar alcohol is a constant companion of many adults, including those who are parents, and their children suffer particularly from it.

Therefore, a very important pillar of the 2021 to 2024 program is the establishment of a mobile dental care program in the Ger districts.

The first "trek" to the Ger districts is scheduled to start in spring 2022. In the longer term, we want to set up our mobile clinic

somewhere in these districts at least every three months and provide direct help for the children on site.

Trek Planning 2022 to 2024


We have learned that we always have to adapt to new conditions; the weather, Covid, conflict in the world, inflation...again and again we plan anew, and still try to pursue our clear goals.

In 2021, only one trek was planned out to rural areas, two took place. But we could not go to the Ger districts because of Covid. For 2022 we plan two treks to remote regions, and in the same year two stays in the Ger districts. And in 2023, we would like to go to the Ger districts every quarter - because the need is very real there.



150% more treatments in 2021

Even though the past two years have been really challenging because of the pandemic, our work is developing at a degree that we never expected. Last year, we more than doubled the number of children treated. The issue of medical dental care for children and adolescents is so important in all regions of the country, because even if modern health care does not reach everyone, candy of the Western world reaches the children.

We are aware that we can only provide primary care. Teeth are restored, those that cannot be saved are extracted. But even we can offer recurrent care in the capital, in the rural areas we would have to return every year, and that's not possible yet. We have been to the north four times and have achieved a lot, but in the long term, the aim is to establish stable dental wards in the remote areas of Mongolia.

This is why the good cooperation we have been able to establish with the government agencies is very important to us. In the longer term, they are the ones who make safe health care for the children possible.

Next step: Establishing the core team

The work of the first years was accomplished with a lot of volunteer engagement involving different people in each treatment cycle. This was possible while working only in Ulaanbaatar. But now our work spreads all over Mongolia and we are often on treks for weeks. At the same time the background work of the foundation has to continue.

Therefore, one of the central tasks in 2022/2023 is to build up a stable core team in Ulaanbaatar. In a permanent office of the foundation, two to three people should be organizing treks and communication all year round. Also, the networking with dentists, the authorities involved and the important stakeholders in the places visited must be done in a stable and regular way.

This should also give the main organizer of the foundation's work, Gabriella Schmidt-Corsitto, more time for project development, new programs, networking and fostering partnerships.


Financial report 2021

After five years of build-up work, a new phase started in 2021 and will last until 2024. The focus is on expanding the programs with mobile clinics and strengthening the structures of the foundation.


This phase has started in 2021 with two dental treks to remote regions, with a fantastic 2'354 children treated. But due to the pandemic, we could hardly do any treatment in the orphanages and daycare centers, and the first Ger districts mission had to be postponed.

This has an impact on the annual financial statement. As only a limited number of treatments could be carried out in the orphanages, the annual accounts closed with a small plus of 16 Mio. tugrik, ca. 5000 Euro. This is relevant because the Foundation's financial cover is rather thin in relation to its growing programs.

2022 will be a challenge. For the first time, the Foundation will send its mobile clinic to the Ger districts and at the same time we organize the long treks again. And in our work in the orphanages, a lot of treatment needs arose during Covid when we could not go to the children. This will lead to an increase in the budget, which we want to make possible with increased fundraising in Mongolia and Europe.
